10. We would like your opinion on a possible programme of intervention for the City of Cape Town, called the **Green Spaces Initiative**, which would improve its public green spaces and outdoor recreation options. The interventions that are being considered and which we want to ask your opinion about include the following:

- Creating or fixing up existing **community parks**. These are those small parks about the size of half a football field, with play equipment for children.
- Creating “**smart parks**”. These are big parks about the size of 4 football fields which have a variety of facilities like garden areas, areas to kick a ball, play parks, skate parks etc, and maybe some small businesses around them, like restaurants. These will be well used, intensively managed and safe to visit.
- Creating more **green belts**. Lots of the rivers in Cape Town are degraded. The idea is to clean these up and create green areas along the rivers. They will have walking and cycling paths and will be well kept to encourage recreational use and safety.
- **Greening the streets** in the suburbs by planting big trees.
- Keeping streets and other public areas **free of litter (rubbish)**. Many areas of the city are poorly serviced and dirty. The city will introduce programmes that will clean up these areas.

How much of this is done depends on what people want and how much they are willing to pay towards it. The **Green Spaces Initiative** would be paid for by households as an addition to the rates bill. This money will go in the Green Spaces Initiative fund, and a board of representatives of citizen associations, environmental organizations and local government will make sure that the money is well spent.

The next questions will help us to work out what the **Green Spaces Initiative** should include. I am going to show you three options for you to choose from.
