# **Overall hypothesis:**

Utilization of forest resources in the Kangra District, Himachal Pradesh, India by rural communities is higher during the COVID-19 pandemic than during the pre-pandemic era, resulting in higher levels of forest degradation and clearing.

### Specific objective of the survey:

Measure and understand the relationships among public forestry policies, tree planting and other LCLU change, and rural livelihoods during the COVID-19 pandemic.
