Swedish Election Study 1991

Principal investigators: Sören Holmberg and Mikael Gilljam, Depart-ment of Political Science, Göteborg University.

Total sample: 3,558 Swedish citizens, age 18-80.

Number of respondents: 2,683

Sample loss: 875 (24.6 %)

Number of variables: ca 500

Weight: Respondents belonging to the 1988-1991 panel who did not respond in 1985 had their sample probability halved in 1991. They are represented by two records in the data file.

Method: In-person interviews. One-half of the sample was interviewed before election day, the other half after. Pre-election respondents also answered a short mail questionnaire immediately after the election, which mainly contained questions on final vote decision.

Panel: The Study represents stage two in the 1988-1991 panel and stage one in the 1991-1994 panel.

Format: OSIRIS, SPSS-x, machine-readable codebook. Avaliable at SSD (Swedish Social Science Data Bank) in Göteborg.

The Swedish Election Studies Programme

The Swedish Election Studies Programme was initiated by Jörgen Westerståhl and Bo Särlvik in the mid 1950s, shortly after the Michigan Election Studies began. The first studies were done in conjunction with the local elections in 1954 and the parliamentary elections in 1956.

In all parliamentary elections since 1956, as well as in the ATP referendum in 1957 and the Nuclear Power referendum in 1980, a large representative sample of eligible voters has been interviewed. The basic design in the latest studies has been a rolling panel in which half of the sample has been interviewed in connection with the previous election, and the other half in connection with the succeeding election. In recent years the sample size has been approximately 3600 and the response rate 75 to 80 per cent.

The early Election Studies were directed by Jörgen Westerståhl (1954-1956), Bo Särlvik (1954-1973) and Olof Petersson (1973-1976). The most recent studies have been directed by Sören Holmberg (1979-1991) and Mikael Gilljam (1985-1991). The latest publication from the programme is Rött Blått Grönt. En bok om 1988 års riksdagsval, (Red Blue Green. A Book on the 1988 Parliamentary election) by Mikael Gilljam and Sören Holmberg with contributions by Kent Asp, Martin Bennulf, Peter Esaiasson and Maria Oskarson.

The questionnaires from the 1991 Election Study were translated into English by Anders Widfeldt.
